

HOUSE BILL 776 - UNIVERSITY INTERSCHOLASTIC LEAGUE

GENERAL INFORMATION

- SB 776 relates to the creation of an inclusive sports program by the University Interscholastic League (UIL) to provide students with disabilities greater access to team sports.
- Cited as "Zariah's Law".
- Authored by Senator Eddie Lucio, Jr. (Brownsville District 27).
- UIL ensures all students with disabilities can participate in team athletic activities.
- Adaptive sports are competitive and run parallel to typical sports activities, providing the needed modifications necessary to participate effectively. Athletes with disabilities are now given an even playing field.
- Effective Sept 1, 2021. The proposed House Bill is HB 2193 and approved on 4/29/21 with a unanimous vote.

WHAT TO EXPECT	WHAT TO EXPECT
 Equitable recognition of athletic events for <u>all students</u>. Adapted sports would subject students with disabilities to the same rules and requirements as other UIL programs. Team practices, seasonal play, and local and statewide competitions would meet UIL standards. Adapted sports will be available in public middle, junior high, and high school students in Texas. 	 UIL will provide federal guidance, guidance from nationally recognized organizations, information regarding the programs, and input from school districts and the Texas Education Agency (TEA). Plans are in place to coordinate with Texas Special Olympics. Supporters of the bill include Down by the Border, UT Austin Disability Advocacy Student Coalition, Disability Rights Texas, Texas Parent to Parent and Coalition of Texans with Disabilities.
