




Special Events

Education

DSASTX Annual Education Conference

Education is an important service the DSASTX provides for individuals with Down syndrome and their families. Throughout this year, we offered 9 Parent Education classes for parents/caregivers, educators, and professionals to learn, connect, and gain the information and resources they need. Our ACE Program provided weekly tutoring sessions for adults with Down syndrome throughout the fall and spring semester. Thank you to our partnership with Lady of the Lake University for giving their time and support to this program with their wonderful tutors. And lastly, we were excited to host our Annual Education Conference at a new venue this year, the Multi Assistance Center! We had 55 attendees, 16 presenters, and exhibitors to provide even more resources and information to our families.

World Down Syndrome Day Classroom Kits

This year we looked to continue to spread Down Syndrome Awareness throughout San Antonio, and especially within our schools. We launched our first World Down Syndrome Day Classroom Kits project earlier this year! We gave out **80 classroom kits** to educators, parents, and community partners in support of spreading Down Syndrome Awareness and making our schools and the the rest of the world a more inclusive place for all!

Speech-Language Pathology

Through a partnership with UT Health's **Department of Communication Sciences and** Disorders, this year the DSASTX Summer Camp program officially became a clinical rotation site for their Speech Pathology students. The students and clinical advisors planned daily activities for the campers with a fun theme for each day of the week which included speech activities and arts/crafts that they could take home. UT Health provided 2 students per camper, plus 4 activity leads and clinical advisors to assist with language enrichment activities that were so important for our participants. Planning sessions and training prior to and during the camp weeks were crucial to the success of the 2024 Summer Camp and we look forward to 2025!

This partnership has been mutually beneficial as the DSASTX gets quality speech programs provided for our campers, and the program students get hands-on experience working with children and teens with disabilities. This year's Summer Camp was huge success with help of this new partnership that we were able to serve 28 campers (children ages 6-15) in 2024!

Media Outreach






